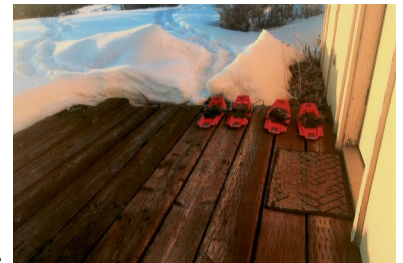

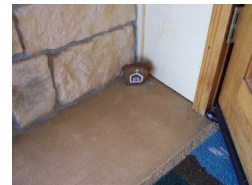
April 6-9, 2021

COMMUNITY NEWS

PRIEST AT MARYMOUNT: If all goes as planned, a priest will be arriving this summer to reside semi-permanently at Marymount Hermitage. It is happy and historic news since it has been 11 years since we had a priest residing here. Father Bill McCann is a priest of the Diocese of Las Cruces, NM and is currently rector of the Cathedral in Las Cruces. His retirement from active ministry is effective July 1. Living at Marymount will give Fr. Bill the opportunity to live a more contemplative life and, as he says, "Let my prayer be my contribution to the Church." He will be offering daily Mass and the opportunity for other sacraments for the hermit community and guests. Father Bill has assured his bishop that he will be available on an "as needed basis" to substitute for the priests of his home diocese, when they need to be gone from their parishes. I will introduce Father Bill McCann to you more completely when he has moved into his hermitage.

INFRASTRUCTURE: I would like to publically thank those who support me actively in maintaining Marymount Hermitage. The Board of Directors includes Joanne Wood of McCall, ID, Bill Bader of Riggins, ID and Sister Michael Francine Duncan, SSMO from Beaverton, OR. We will have a board meeting on June 9.

For years, Ceara and Mike Nourse have been processing new books for the library. They are retiring from this work now. I ask prayers of blessings on them, and that a new volunteer will be forthcoming. Thank you!

Lastly, I obviously cannot do all the maintenance work for buildings without paid workman and volunteers. Retreatants often ask what work they can do while here for a balance between prayer and work. Mike Wack found Station #12 on the ground after a severe wind storm. He remounted it, but he and Denise have promised to refurbish all the Stations when they

come on retreat next year.

Lastly, please pray for the repose of the soul of Chuck Uhlenkott, a past benefactor, who died in May. Chuck and Tim Uhlenkott drilled our well and installed the pressure tank for the pump and water system. Chuck is the father of Fr. Mark Uhlenkott.

Prayers also for David Spencer of Uhlenkott Pump Service, who had recently bought Chuck's business. Dave worked on this well and pump in February. He died tragically in a boating accident on May 22. He leaves a wife and seven young children, the oldest of whom is nine. Please pray for this grieving family. May Chuck and Dave rest in peace.

DAY OF PILGRIMAGE: The first group retreat at Marymount will be held on Saturday, August 28 from 9 AM to 4 PM. Father Dominique Faure, VS will give two talks on the Scriptural theme "Show Us the Father" and "Jesus, Revealer of the Father". There will be time for adoration, private prayer, confession and/or spiritual direction from the two priests present. We will have Mass at midday followed by a catered lunch. Attendance will be limited to 30 people, so sign up early! The event is free and open to the public, however a registration fee of \$15 is requested and is pre-payment for lunch. Registration will be open until Monday, August 23. Call or email to register. More information is on the website under the **Calendar of Events**.

ROADWORK: Hermitage Lane will have major reconstruction work done during Oct. or Nov. I am still waiting for the bid from the contractor, Nick Seubert of Cottonwood, ID. I sincerely appreciate the generous donations which have been received towards this fund. The total to date is \$10,267.

FAMILY NEWS: We will have the funeral and burial for my father, Robert Greger, and my brother, Thomas Greger, at the parish of St. Clare in Portland, OR on Saturday, August 7. Thank you for praying for me and my family for safe travels and peaceful closure after this long wait. I sincerely appreciate the priests who have offered to say Mass for Dad and Tom and for those people who have sent lovely condolence cards and generous gifts as memorials. God bless you!
